



 - East Lansing, MI (3)




What We Do






Waterfowl Habitat Conservation Strategy

- Annual monitoring effort run throughout NA
- Roadside surveys, 50 stops along route
- Developed to track trends in bird populations at large scales
- Tracks some species better than others






Sandhill Cranes in Minnesota MN Coop. Unit, FWS, MN DNR




Mid-Continent Population (MCP)

- Population roughly about 500,000
- Hunted in each state in flyway except Nebraska
- Minnesota established hunting season in 2010




Eastern Population (EP)


- Population ~80,000
- Only two states (KY and TN) allow a small-scale season
- Illegal to hunt in Minnesota

Sandhill crane locations in Minnesota based on preliminary data from the Minnesota Breeding Bird Atlas




